Adult High School Pilot Program



The Adult High School Pilot Program ("AHS Program") establishes an alternative pathway for adults who did not graduate from high school to earn a high school diploma in an environment that meets the needs of the adult learner. Students may potentially earn post-secondary credits and/or an industry-recognized certification while completing their secondary education requirements.

Students enrolled in an adult high school under the AHS Program must be twenty-one (21) years of age or older, have not earned a high school diploma, and have not completed the requirements for a high school diploma through the National External Diploma Program® (NEDP) or GED® testing program.

The AHS Program is under the authority of the <u>Maryland State Department of Education</u> (marylandpublicschools.org) and the <u>Maryland Department of Labor</u> (www.labor.maryland.gov).

The Adult High School Program became effective July 1, 2017.
